

Works Cited Tips

- The title Works Cited should not be underlined.
- The entries should be arranged alphabetically by the authors' family names.
- A work for which no author or editor is available is listed by the title of the work, alphabetized by the first word that is not "an", "a", or "the".
- The Works Cited list is double-spaced. (Format- paragraph)
- The first line of each entry begins from the left-hand margin, and all later lines are indented five spaces (or use a hanging indent of one-half inch). (Format- paragraph)
- In all entries, two spaces follow a period, one space follows a comma, and one space follows a colon.
- Your name and page number should be included on the top right hand corner of the page a Header. (View- Header Footer)
